

What Students Need at Home:

- computer with MS Word (for high school essays)
- Internet access
- an email account that accepts attachments

What Students Need to Bring to Class:

- two mechanical pencils (there is no pencil sharpener in our classroom)
- a black pen to use for taking quizzes
- a three-ring notebook (you probably want a pretty decent sized one)
- loose-leaf paper (NOT the type you tear out—this is not allowed in the building)

Expectations and Preparedness:

Students should...

- finish assignments and bring them to class,
- contribute to class discussions and group activities, and
- want to have fun while learning!

Students, call or email me if you have questions! *I really enjoy working with high schoolers LIKE YOU*, and I want you to succeed!

Parents, if your student is having any difficulties (which is normal for first-year students in the beginning; trust me, it happens all the time—don't despair! ©), let me know as soon as possible so I can offer help.

As we all remember, high school brings new challenges for students—and it can take a little time to adjust!

Conduct Essentials:

- Speak courteously to each other and to me (1 Peter 3:8).
- Inappropriate talk—anything sexual in nature, bad language, insulting, and so on—is unacceptable and
 is grounds for immediate dismissal. (This includes anything I am made aware of, including email, texts,
 instant messages, and anything on Facebook or Twitter or other social media, regardless of whether it
 happens in class or not.)

Attendance

If your student will be absent, please email me (scott@homeschoolpartners.net) or call/text me (828-707-0266) or to let me know.

Students, please be sure to arrive at least 5-10 minutes before class starts. That way he/she can get settled, get materials out, get a drink, use the restroom, etc.—and we can start on time.

Quizzes, Grades, and Suggested Grade Reports

High School, SAT Prep, Latin, Logic:

Quizzes in high school classes are mostly in class, although some are take-home. I will score these and give them back to your student, unless you prefer to as a parent. (If so, just let me know you'd like the key and I'll email it to you.) Please return take-home guizzes by the next class if you want them scored.

As a convenience, I will regularly email suggested grade reports (in Microsoft Excel format) to parents of students in high school classes. At the end of the year, I will email parents a report with course listings and suggested grades for each subject. Of course, parents, as the primary teachers, it's up to you how you use the report. High school class scores are calculated by combining guizzes and homework.

Math:

Quizzes in all math classes are done at home using the test forms parents should purchase. I am happy to offer any insight if requested.

Dress Code

Student dress should be modest and appropriate for a learning environment. The following items are not permitted:

- ripped/frayed jeans, cutoffs, or other sloppy clothes
- flip flops or backless shoes
- tattoos
- visible body piercings/cuttings except for earrings for girls

Girls:

Parents, please check your daughter to make sure she is modest (1 Timothy 2:9). If you have any doubts, please err on the side of caution.

- Skirts/shorts: close to the knee or below.
- Blouses: buttoned, to the collarbone, covering the midsection completely.
- Not permitted: revealing/tight blouses or pants, spaghetti straps, sleeveless blouses, tank tops, yoga pants, or *anything that even comes close to immodesty*.

Guys:

Not permitted:

- hats indoors
- hair below the collar or in your eyes
- earrings, or anything else that looks feminine (1 Corinthians 11:14).

Statement of Faith

I approach subjects from a Christian worldview. I believe that the Bible alone (the 66 books of the Old and New Testaments only) is God's inerrant word (Matthew 5:18, 2 Timothy 3:16-17, 2 Peter 1:20-21). We'll discuss other worldviews, but any beliefs contrary to Biblical Christianity will be presented as false. Teaching and assignments are based on these beliefs:

- 1. There is one eternally existing triune God—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit (Deuteronomy 6:4, 1 John 5:7).
- 2. God created the world and everything in it in six twenty-four-hour days, including man on the sixth day (Genesis 1). Adam sinned, breaking his covenant with God. As a result, all creation was cursed. Death and sin entered the world through the one man, Adam (Genesis 3, Romans 5:12). God promised a Savior who would come and reverse the effects of the curse. The animal killed by God and whose skin He used to cover Adam and Eve fore-shadowed Christ's death to pay for our sins (Genesis 3:15, 21).
- 3. Jesus came in the form of a man to be the atoning sacrifice for the sins of all mankind (John 3:16, Romans 3:22-23, 2 Peter 3:9, 1 Timothy 2:4, 1 Timothy 4:10, 2 Peter 2:1, 1 John 2:2) by his one-time, completed, never-to-be-repeated death (John 19:30, Hebrews 9:26, 28; 10:12-18). Jesus is God (John 1:1-3, Colossians 1:16, John 8:56-58, John 5:16-18, John 10:30) and every Christian's high priest (Hebrews 4:14), the only mediator between God and man (1 Timothy 2:5). Jesus rose from the dead, and He is now seated at the right hand of God (Acts 2:32-35).
- 4. Mankind is not saved from his sins by good works, adherence to creeds or confessionals, attempted compliance with any or all of the Ten Commandments or other Mosaic laws, or obedience to church traditions or rituals, but by faith in Jesus Christ (John 14:6, Acts 4:12, Romans 4:5, 6:23; Ephesians 2:8-10, Hebrews 9:22).

Registration

High School Classes

\$125 for a single student, and \$100 for each additional student. **Example:** Two siblings would be \$125 for the first, and \$100 for the second, for a total of \$225. Three siblings would be \$125 for the first, \$100 for the second, and \$100 for the third, for a total of \$325.

Math or Elective (Latin I, Latin II, SAT Prep, Logic) – \$50 per student.

NOTE: High School 1A, 1B, 2A, and 2B classes include one of these four electives (**not math**) for each student, so you do not need to pay an additional registration fee for that particular elective.

Example 1: If you sign up your student for High School 1B with Latin 1, the enrollment fee is \$125. Since either Latin 1 or Latin 2 **is included** as an elective with 1B, you do not need to pay an additional \$50 to sign your student up for Latin 1 or Latin 2.

Example 2: If you sign up your student for High School 2B with SAT Prep, the enrollment fee is \$125. Since either SAT Prep or Logic **is included** as an elective with 2B, you do not need to pay an additional \$50 for Logic or SAT Prep.

Example 3: If you sign up your student for Pre-Algebra, Algebra 1, Algebra 2, Latin I, Latin II, SAT Prep, or Logic only—as a separate class, without the high school set it is included with—the enrollment fee is \$50.

Tuition:

Tuition is remitted three times per year (one-third each time) as follows:

- one third on the first class in August
- one third on the first class in November
- one third on the first class in February

Amounts due on each of these class days are as follows:

- High School 1B or 2B \$500
- Math, Latin, SAT Prep \$125
- Logic \$200 (the full amount for this one-semester class; this is due by the first class in August).

Any other tuition arrangements *must be made in advance*. I am very happy to be flexible if necessary (for example, if how you are paid varies from month to month). But I count on tuition for my living, so I would really appreciate it if you didn't contact me the week before tuition is due to say, "We can't be on time with Johnny's tuition because I don't get paid until the 15th," or something similar. Thank you!
